


First Sunday in Advent, 2005

Dear Friends,

It's Advent in a transitional year for us. The three of us, Suzi, Rich and Kevin, are finishing up our first full year in Anchorage running KUDO radio. Throughout this time Rich has continued to run



a regional media program in the former Communist world, expanding into the Middle East, using the Internet and telephone. He had three trips abroad, one to Morocco (below—Suzi was able to join him there) and Jordan (Petra is on the left), one to Armenia and Georgia, and one, planned for early December, to the Balkans. The last one is to close out the program. The IREX regional media development program ends on December 31 and Rich will put his full attention to Anchorage radio.
